Subject	Learning	Ways to support your child at home:
Literacy & Reading	In Literacy, we will be writing, a balanced argument, stories with a historical setting and poetry. Throughout the term, we will be focusing on vocabulary, grammar, punctuation and spelling. Children will be undertaking a spelling test by the end of the term on the year 3 spelling lists. In reading, they will be reading non-fiction texts about Ancient Egyptians and a fiction story called Hodgeheg.	20 minutes Reading is recommended. Ask children questions about the text and what the text is about. Practise year 3 spellings.
Maths	In our maths lessons, we will be revisiting all the topics that we have covered since the beginning of the academic year in order to revisit formal written methods and test style questions. We are encouraging children to develop a deeper understanding of the relationship between different aspects of maths.	Maths books are sent home every Tuesday. A Picture Problem is sent at the beginning of each new unit. Encourage your children to use MyMaths to consolidate topics taught in numeracy.
Science	Children will be learning all about magnets and springs. They will be encouraged to make predictions and pose questions about magnets and springs. They will be using scientific vocabulary and will carry out a range of experiments and fair testing to support their learning. I.C.T.	Children will be using ICT to understand more about coding, as well as using the internet to research topics further. They will be encouraged to use power-point and word as appropriate to their learning.	Work on a power-point together at home on the Ancient Egyptians.
R.E	Children will be learning about aspects of creation and green issues in our lessons. They will be studying about the different representations of how the world was created and learning about the importance of respecting the environment.	Discuss different representations of how the world was created. Mind map the reasons for respecting the environment.
P.E	Children will be developing their skills in cricket and will also be taking part in athletics. They will have the opportunity to show their athletics skills during the sports day.	Discuss the rules of cricket. How many different athletics events can they name?
P.HS.C.E.	Children will have the opportunity to learn about what to do in an emergency. We will be looking at e-safety during the I.C.T lessons and also be discussing other emergency services that help us.	Discuss different emergency services and how these help us. Discuss the importance of e-safety.

Art	Children will be linking this with the Ancient Egyptians topic. They will be designing Egyptian jewellery and continuing with learning a range of art skills including observational drawing of 3d objects.	Encourage your child to experiment using a 2B or B pencil. Look at pictures of Egyptian jewellery together and discuss the common features.
D.T	Children will be making Egyptian jewellery using modelling clay. They will also paint these.	Look at pictures of Egyptian jewellery - discuss what they were like.
Geography/ History	We will be learning about the Rushey Mead (the local area) in geography. They will be given the opportunity to look at maps. History will be linked to the topic of Ancient Egyptians. We will be learning about timelines, Ancient Egyptian rituals, attitudes and beliefs. Music	Year 3 children will be developing their recorder skills. Music assemblies each week will given children an opportunity to develop their singing skills.	Please ensure that your child practises the recorder regularly.
Trips	Possible trips this term will include New Walk Museum.
