Different parts of the earth receive different amounts of sunlight causing morning, noon, evening and night<br/>           The seasons are caused by the tilt of the Earth's rotational axis away or toward the sun as it travels through its year around the sun<br/>           Latitude and longitude are lines used to describe the location of any place on Earth. Lines of latitude run in an east-west direction across Earth. Lines of longitude run in a north-south direction.<br/>           Water, Soil, Timber, Salt, Oil, Natural Gas, Coal, Iron, Bauxite and Helium<br/>           Venezuela, Saudi Arabia and Iran<br/>           Ozone layer is layer in the earth's stratosphere which absorbs most of the ultraviolet radiation reaching the earth from the sun. Ozone depletion occurs when gases are released into the atmosphere that break down ozone molecules, reducing ozone's radiation-absorbing capacity.<br/>           Global warming occurs when carbon dioxide (CO2) and greenhouse gases collect in the atmosphere and absorb sunlight and solar radiation that have bounced off the earth's surface.<br/>           The 'greenhouse effect' is the warming of climate that results when the atmosphere traps heat radiating from Earth toward space.<br/>           Non-biodegradable products cannot be broken down by natural organisms and acts as a source of pollution<br/>           Decompose-make or become rotten; decay or cause to decay.<br/>           Landfill-the disposal of waste material by burying it.<br/>           Fossil Fuels-coal, oil, and natural gas<br/>           Renewal energy is from a source that is not depleted when used, such as wind or solar power.<br/>           Carbon footprint means the amount of carbon dioxide released into the atmosphere by individuals or a community because of their activities.<br/>           Volcanic Eruptions and tectonic movements<br/>           A tsunami is a large ocean wave that is caused by sudden motion on the ocean floor. This sudden motion could be an earthquake, a powerful volcanic eruption, or an underwater landslide<br/>           Globalization-the interaction and integration of people in different areas of the world<br/>           Reasons for emigrating- economy, employment, education<br/>           Sweatshops-Long hours, low pay</p> |
