Howard Carter discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun in November 1922. River Nile was important to daily life: fishing, sailing, agriculture Chocolate Ancient Mayans discovered the coca bean. George Cadbury introduced Bourneville and was the founder of Bourneville. Victorians The Industrial Revolution was a time when the manufacturing of goods moved from small shops and homes to large factories Queen Elizabeth is Queen Victoria's great, great grandma. Dr Barnardo was the founder of many homes for poor children and started the charity Barnardo's. The Factory Act (1833) prohibited the employment of children. The Workhouse Romans Hadrian's Wall was a stone barrier built to separate the Romans and the Picts tribes in Scotland. It allowed Roman soldiers to control the movements of people coming into or leaving Roman Britain. Jewry Wall Roman Baths are in Bath Fosse Way and Gartree Road were paved during Roman times. Vikings Romans, Anglo Saxons and then Vikings Alfred the Great (849-899) was the most famous of the Anglo-Saxon kings. Despite overwhelming odds, he successfully defended his kingdom against the Vikings. At Sutton Hoo, are eleven mounds or 'barrows' dating back to the 7th century.
