Know that cream tea usually consists of tea and scones with clotted cream and jam. Know that Afternoon Tea is a meal composed of sandwiches (usually cut delicately into 'fingers'), scones with clotted cream and jam, sweet pastries and cakes Know that Royal Ascot is a four-day horse-racing event at Ascot that takes place every June. It is known as a social event, especially for rich people, where women wear expensive fashionable clothes and hats. Cucumber sandwiches are most often served for a light snack or at afternoon tea, a formal light meal served at four in the afternoon or early evening before the main supper. Traditionally, Devon spread clotted cream on the scone, then finish with a dollop of jam, while the Cornish tradition does the reverse, with jam going first and clotted cream on top.</p>
