It marks the Sikh new year and commemorates the formation of Khalsa panth of warriors under Guru Gobind Singh in 1699. Vaisakhi is also an ancient festival celebrating the spring harvest.</p> <p>Know that the origins of bhangra moves-a dance associated with the Punjab where Sikhs originate from are moves to show farmers during harvest time.</p> <p>The Golden Temple is the most famous Sikh temple in the world.</p>
