


What are SATs?

These are Standard Assessment Tests. The are national curriculum tests that Year 6 children take at the end of Key stage 2.


These tests help measure the progress pupils have made and identify if they need additional support or further challenges in a certain area for when they transition to Secondary School.

They are also used to used to assess the school's performance and to produce national performance data.



Why are the tests so important?

- SATs results are used as a 'measure' for the progress children make during their time at primary school.
- The SATs give an insight into the standard of work and commitment expected in Year 7.
- This result will be sent to you and their secondary school. Many secondary schools no longer test in the first few weeks, but 'set' children using their SATs result.



As a result of your child's performance in the tests, they will be given a 'standard'.

This is called a scaled score.

This shows whether they are working <u>towards</u>, <u>at</u> or at <u>greater depth</u> within the expected standard.

Year 6 children will take the same tests.

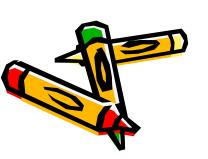



Out of 50 marks (60 mins)

The Mathematics Tests

- Arithmetic paper out of 40 marks (30 mins)
- Paper 2: reasoning out of 35 marks (40 mins)
- Paper 3: reasoning out of 35 marks (40 mins)

'Access arrangements might be used to support pupils who have:


- difficulty reading

- English as an additional language'






These arrangements may include:


- 25% additional time


