Year 1 Phonics Screening Check


What is phonics?

•Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'. They are then taught how to blend these sounds together to read the whole word.

·Children have a 30 minutes phonics lesson each day and they are encouraged to use these strategies to

read and write in other lessons.

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Why are the children being screened?

- •Every Year 1 child in the country will be taking the phonics screening check in the same week in June.
- •The aim of the check is to ensure that all children are able to read by the end of Year 2.
- •This 'midpoint check' will ensure that we have a clear understanding of what the children need to learn in Year 2.

What will the children be expected to do?

- •The check is very similar to reading tasks the children already complete during phonics lessons.
- ·Children will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sounds together. For example eg d-o-g dog d o q
- •The focus of the check is to see which sounds the children know and therefore the children will be asked to read made up 'nonsense' words.

This is not a reading test

Examples of words:

in at vap osk beg ect sum

When will the screening take place?

- •The screening will take place throughout the week beginning Monday 10th June. The children cannot retake the test at any other time so it is very important your child is in school during this week.
- The check has been designed so that children of all abilities will be able to take part.

Who will complete the check?

- •The children will complete the check one at a time in a quiet area of the school.
- A teacher will conduct all of the screening checks with the children.
- ·The screening will only take
- 5-10mins with each child.

•Encourage your child to 'sound out' when reading or writing. Focusing particularly on spotting more unusual sound patterns.

Eg

<u>Digraph</u>- 2 letters making one sound

COW

Trigraphs- 3 letters making one sound

night

<u>Split digraphs-</u> 2 vowels with a consonant in between.

spine i_e

- ·Point out (or allow your child to point out) different digraphs and trigraphs that they recognise in words.
- •Encourage children to sound out words and blend everywhere e.g. Shop names, street names etc.
